Program Notes

Graduates are listed alphabetically under the degree they are receiving, Bachelor of Fine Arts, Bachelor of Science or Bachelor of Arts. In some cases, a student may earn more than one bachelor's degree during his or her undergraduate years. The student's major(s) are listed to the right of his or her hometown, with a concentration indicated within parentheses. Directly below each name is the student's hometown. Titles of yearlong Senior Theses or Senior Creative Projects judged to merit recognition appear in italics underneath the hometown, along with the name and terminal degree of the faculty supervisor.

President's Medalists wear gold medals awarded in recognition of their status. Students graduating *summa cum laude, magna cum laude* and *cum laude Latin honors* wear gold, silver and red tassels respectively on their caps. Student members of Mortar Board, a national honor society that recognizes college seniors for their achievements in scholarship, leadership and service, also wear gold tassels on their caps.

Music for the program was coordinated by the Denison Department of Music. Today's processionals are selections chosen from *The Water Music* (1717) and *Music for the Royal Fireworks* (1749) by George Frideric Handel (1685-1759). *Fanfare for the Class of 2017* is an original composition by Associate Professor of Music HyeKyung Lee, previously played at their induction in August 2013. The commencement orchestra is conducted by Assistant Professor of Music Chris David Westover.

Parents or friends taking pictures of graduates receiving diplomas are asked to use the special section designated for this purpose.

Flowers for the program are provided by Village Flower Basket. Interpretive signing is done by Hallenross & Associates, LLC. The program concludes when the platform party and faculty have recessed. The audience and graduates are asked to remain seated during the recessional. If Commencement is held in the Mitchell Center, the graduates will also recess.

Academic Regalia

The academic costume which makes the Commencement procession so colorful is more than 800 years old, dating back to the days when students were members of the minor clergy and wore monkish gowns and hoods. Today, the hood is used only as an ornament. It is lined with the colors of the university conferring the degree: the border in which it is edged indicates the scholar's field. The colors seen in today's Denison procession and the fields they represent are: Dark Blue: Philosophy; White: Humanities; Golden Yellow: Science; Light Blue: Education; Brown: Fine Arts; Pink: Music; Silver Gray: Oratory (Speech); Scarlet: Theology; Lemon Yellow: Library Science; Sage Green: Physical Education; Drab: Commerce, Accountancy, Business.

Retiring Faculty

FRANK L. HASSEBROCK

B.A., University of Illinois; M.A., California State University, Long Beach; Ph.D., University of Minnesota Associate Professor Emeritus of Psychology

Under different circumstances, Frank Hassebrock might have become a lawyer. But exposure to psychology as a college undergrad made him quickly recognize his passion. "I love the part of psychology that studies individuals, thinking about how we think, feel and act," he said. "And because I'm a cognitive psychologist, it helps me know how people learn. I've been a big believer in active learning with students. It's not about what I tell them as much as creating situations and opportunities to be engaged in their own learning, whether solving problems, analyzing a complex issue or something else."

In 1983, the year in which he earned his Ph.D. in educational psychology at Minnesota, he joined the ranks of the Denison faculty.

Beyond teaching, Hassebrock views becoming the inaugural director of the Center for Learning and Teaching in 2015 as a clear highlight of his time at Denison. He previously was a Faculty Fellow for Learning and Teaching, a precursor to the Center. "The Center supports faculty in developing their own effective teaching — its mission is to help instructors of all levels of experience," he said. Offerings have ranged from workshop series such as "Learning, Teaching, and the Brain: Developing a Toolkit for Supporting Denison Students" to a monthly faculty discussion group called "Teaching Matters." In Denison governance service, Hassebrock held several important positions, including chair of the Academic Affairs Council and chair of the Student Enrollment and Retention Committee. He also was named to the Charles and Nancy Brickman Distinguished Service Chair, which he held from 2013 to 2017.

Hassebrock is looking forward to traveling in retirement, including continuing a tradition with a group of friends of visiting baseball stadiums. Hassebrock will visit the Atlanta Braves' stadium this summer, which he says will leave only one existing major league ballpark he hasn't visited. But you also can count on him taking in the performing arts, an appreciation which was broadened for him by his late wife Cheri Mitchell, a respected and beloved performing arts administrator. He remembers how the Denison community supported him after her passing in 2015. "I was lucky to have many strong relationships and friends here," he said. "I'll never forget how good they were to me."

Hassebrock will miss the many experiences with students, chief among them just having a chance to have an impact, along with the intrigue of developing new pedagogical approaches. "These last 34 years have meant so much," he said. "You realize just how special this place really is."

JAMES REED PLETCHER B.A., UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN; M.A., PH.D., UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-MADISON Associate Professor Emeritus of Political Science

Jim Pletcher has learned from the experience of many stays abroad, most particularly in Africa, where he first journeyed to conduct his dissertation research in 1979.

"I was originally encouraged to learn about this part of the world of which I knew little as an undergraduate. I ended up, over the years, having so many from Africa assist me in expanding my knowledge," said Pletcher, whose most notable papers include "The Politics of Liberalizing Zambia's Maize Markets" for World Development. "I feel tremendous gratitude toward those people who helped me."

He feels the same when it comes to Denison colleagues who were vital in developing his teaching style early in his career. "When I started at Denison in 1983, the notion of lecture and exams in class was more in style, but I learned from colleagues to do less talking and more working on problems in small groups or individually," he explained. "I love having students answering questions, asking questions and challenging judgments."

Pletcher was the chair of the Department of Political Science from 1989 to 2000 and again from 2006 to 2009. His career path toward increased administrative responsibilities at the college began in the 1990s and culminated in being appointed as associate provost for academic affairs in 2013.

"I had done work for a committee involved in strategic planning and got interested as I became more exposed to the university as an organization," he said. "Taking on administrative duties while still working with students redirected me in a positive way."

He has served in several faculty governance roles, including coordinating the Early Career Mentoring Program. "For the program, we tried to create something which would greet incoming faculty and give guidance — looking back at our own experiences helped us figure out what they would need," he explained. "It was also a chance to talk about the ethos of the university."

Pletcher, who held the Charles and Nancy Brickman Distinguished Service Chair from 2007 to 2010, served as director of fellowships, as well as acting director of the Gilpatrick Center. "This was an opportunity to work with students who were in other disciplines in a closer way, and you just saw how creative and smart students were from all over the university," he said.

Pletcher was also the executive director and later chair of the board of the Africa Network, a non-profit coalition of teachers at liberal arts colleges who instruct on Africa.

Pletcher is excited to continue his interest in woodworking and cooking in retirement, in addition to having the shoe on the other foot — by becoming more of a student again. "I would like to take classes in subjects outside my area of research," he said. "I have a curiosity about philosophy, so that may be one. I think the history of architecture could be another. There's no reason to stop learning."

Retiring Faculty

Lynn Cunard Schweizer

B.A., Ohio University; M.A., Ohio State University Associate Professor Emerita of Health, Exercise, and Sport Studies

The term "trailblazer" is used often in the world of athletics. Sometimes with good reason, sometimes it's merely cliché. To be a true trailblazer, one must be an innovator, a leader, and possess a certain authenticity that shines through in an instant.

Senior Associate Director of Athletics Lynn Schweizer is saying goodbye to the place she has called home for the last 44 years. As a native of Granville, she didn't have to travel far. Schweizer was hired in 1973 as the head women's basketball coach. Things were different then. The ink hadn't dried on Title IX, and she stepped headlong into a sporting world that had long been dominated by males. While her title was "coach," the job entailed much more. In those early years, she sewed the uniforms by hand, drove the van, and mentored young women through the most transformative time in their lives. She became the women's swimming & diving coach in 1974, producing multiple All-Americans and laying the foundation for the program's ascension to national prominence.

In the late 1980s, Schweizer stepped away from the sidelines, choosing to take on an administrative role. That decision proved to change the course of Big Red athletics forever. From 1985 through 2004, she chaired the Department of Physical Education. She also took the reins as Denison's director of club and intramural sports in 1986. Mix in her leadership role with college's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, and she effectively had a hand in every facet of the athletic department.

What did all of this really mean? Access. Through her added roles, Schweizer had access to even more students and staff. Through that access, Schweizer's innate mentorship abilities took hold.

"Lynn gracefully employs balance in everything she does," stated Dan Crawford '11. "Whether female, male, scholar, athlete, coach or administrator, she selflessly gives her time and energy to bring people together and make them better."

Grace is a powerful word. She displayed that when working alongside then Director of Athletics Larry Scheiderer as they combined the women's and men's athletics departments into one entity. A lifetime of mentoring came full circle in 2011, when one of her former basketball players, Nan Carney-DeBord '80, was named Denison's new director of athletics.

"Saying yes to that job offer in 1973 led to more than 40 years of wonderful relationships," said Schweizer. "What I cherish the most are the close bonds I have formed with fellow staff members, and all of the past and current students."

"Lynn's mentorship style is natural," said Alison Teopas '08. "A true mentor is always there when you need her. Happy, sad, through challenges, and everywhere in between, Lynn is there. I currently oversee the NCAA's Student-Athlete Leadership Forum that Lynn encouraged me to attend as a Denison student. She helped me reach my goals, and everything has come full-circle."

Anita M. Waters B.A., Mary Washington College; M.A., M.Phil., Ph.D., Columbia University Professor Emerita of Anthropology and Sociology

Anita Waters studies sociology, she says, because "it always strives not merely to interpret the world, but to change it." Waters has similar goals. Since joining the Denison faculty in 1992, she has been involved in service efforts that have included everything from serving on the Licking County Corrections Planning Board to working with the Somali immigrant community in Columbus — a passion of hers. "I am engaged in sociology as a social actor," Waters said, "because I believe that what seem to be 'inevitable' injustices, 'unavoidable' human suffering, and 'natural' hierarchies are really malleable and redeemable."

From 1998 to 2006, she took to the Denison airwaves to effect cultural change among the student body, hosting a weekly radio show on WDUB called Remedial Reggae because, she said, "students so often enter college without having listened to enough reggae." Waters famously conducted the last known interview with the legendary Bob Marley and attended his funeral while she was attending graduate school.

Waters has held a variety of faculty leadership positions during her Denison career, serving on the President's Advisory Board and the Black Studies Committee, as well as chair of the faculty. Reflecting on her tenure, she also notes pride in her work as chair of the Department of Sociology/Anthropology, where she worked to diversify the faculty. Other highlights include her work on Denison's Posse college access program ("Being a Posse mentor has been my favorite part of the last four years.") and a law enforcement observation project she has been running since 2000 ("I argued in an *Anthropology of Law* journal article that the project not only taught students how to conduct field studies, but it was also a form of public surveillance of police.").

Her interests have shifted during her career. A focus on Caribbean political cultures moved from music and arts towards historical narratives. Her study of anthropology, which started when she joined the merged Sociology/Anthropology Department, "has shown me that there is a wide variety of ways that human needs can be met, and the kind of society we find ourselves in is not the only one possible." The students, Waters said, have changed, too — she sees both a greater variety of students and deeper engagement. "I'm proud to work at a college that offers excellent scholarships and financial aid for good students, especially first-generation students."

Retirement will offer her time to expand her studies of Caribbean political cultures. She also is weighing a few writing projects, with topics ranging from over-policing in Jamaica and the U.S., to historical commemorations in Havana, Cuba, and Miami's "Little Havana" neighborhood, to border work at the disciplinary boundary between anthropology and sociology. She also wants to develop her skills as an organizer, working with the Ohio Conference of the American Association of University Professors to form advocacy chapters of the AAUP in small private colleges.

But there are no plans to stray very far. "I'll mostly stay local," said Waters, "and continue to work on issues of interest to the Somali community in Columbus."

The musicians comprising the string quartet ETHEL have been Denison's artists-in-residence over the last three years. ETHEL's residency has profoundly impacted Denison students across the academic disciplines, and their scholarship moves well beyond the beauty and talent of their musicality. They have embraced the liberal arts ethos of the college and deepened the education of our students. Their work has created incredible learning moments for Denison students, faculty, and staff.

"My colleagues and I are humbled by this extraordinary honor," said ETHEL founding member Ralph Farris, who is the group's violist and co-artistic director along with cellist Dorothy Lawson. Farris continued, "ETHEL's residency at Denison University has brought us one inspiring experience after another — conversations, explorations, collaborations, performances — all in service of the school's 'firm belief in human dignity and compassion unlimited by cultural, racial, sexual, religious or economic barriers.' It is truly a gift to be welcomed into this community."

Established in New York City in 1998, ETHEL earned a reputation as one of America's most adventurous string quartets. Part of a generation of young artists blending uptown, conservatory musicianship with downtown genre-crossing, ETHEL plays with the intensity and accouterments of a rock band. The New York Times has described them as "indefatigable and eclectic," and The New Yorker has deemed them "vital and brilliant." Nearly two decades into their singular career, ETHEL has, in turn, become seminal in its own right, a path breaker for countless younger genre-spanning ensembles and a prolific commissioner of new music.

In addition to premiering 21st century works by a broad range of groundbreaking composers, ETHEL creates and tours rich, often multimedia, productions in which community engagement is a key element. Among their current and recent evening-length works are ETHEL's "Documerica," inspired by the tens of thousands of images shot as part of the Environmental Protection Agency's decade-long "Project Documerica; Grace," featuring ETHEL's arrangements of music by Ennio Morricone and Jeff Buckley; "Blue Dress," which pays special homage to women making their musical mark in the 21st century; "The River," a collaboration with Taos Pueblo flutist Robert Mirabal, released as an album in June 2016.

ETHEL has collaborated with artists including David Byrne, Bang on a Can All-Stars, Kaki King, Todd Rundgren, Carlo Mombelli, Ursula Oppens, Juana Molina, Tom Verlaine, STEW, Ensemble Modern, Jill Sobule, Dean Osborne, Robert Mirabal, Howard Levy, Simone Sou, Andrew Bird, Iva Bittová, Colin Currie, Thomas Dolby, Jeff Peterson, Oleg Fateev, Stephen Gosling, Jake Shimabukuro, Polygraph Lounge and Vijay Iyer.

The quartet regularly performs works by all of the members of the ensemble, alongside music by Philip Glass, Julia Wolfe, Phil Kline, David Lang, Dan Friel, Mary Ellen Childs, John King, Raz Mesinai, John Zorn, Missy Mazzoli, Anna Clyne, Steve Reich, Kenji Bunch, Don Byron, Aleksandra Vrebalov, Marcelo Zarvos, Pamela Z, Evan Ziporyn and Terry Riley. Over the past five years, ETHEL has premiered 150-plus new works, many of them commissioned by the quartet.

Scott Clark Schurz Sr. '57

B.A., Denison University; L.H.D., Indiana University at South Bend

Scott Schurz is a well-known publisher and philanthropist in the state of Indiana. Upon graduation from Denison, he taught at the University of Maryland and then served in the U.S. Army for two years. He then embarked on a career in the newspaper business that led him to his current position as president and publisher of the Herald-Times (Bloomington, Ind.) and vice president and director of Schurz Communications (South Bend, Ind.), a media firm operating radio, television, cable, and newspapers in 10 states.

Professional leadership roles in which Scott has served include his presidencies of the Hoosier State Press Association, the Inland Press Association, and the International Newspaper Marketing Association. He has served on the boards of directors of the Newspaper Association of America, the Newspaper Advertising Bureau, and the Inter-American Press Association.

Scott's leadership benefits his community in many ways. He has served as a member of the Bloomington/Monroe County Community Foundation, Monroe County Historical Society Advisory Council, and Bloomington Arts Council. He is a committed supporter and past president of the Bloomington Boy's Club, Junior Achievement of Monroe County, vice president of the Monroe County Chapter of the American Cancer Society, and Bloomington Little League football (for which he has also served as coach!). He generously commits his skills and resources to educational institutions as well, including Denison University, the University of Notre Dame, Centre College, and Indiana University, where he serves on the I.U. Foundation Board.

Scott and his wife Kay are the parents of three children, one of whom, John D. Schurz, is a member of the class of 1995. Scott's sister, Mary Schurz, is a 1960 Denison alumna who published The Advocate-Messenger of Danville, Kentucky.
